

CDL Truck Driving Program

Are there program restrictions for the Commercial Driving Program at Lake Superior College?

Yes. Please note that you are **not eligible** to drive Minnesota State vehicles if you have had ANY of the following major violations <u>in the last five years</u>. If the State of Minnesota Risk Management discovers you have any of these violations, you will be dropped from the Program without a refund.

- Driving Under the Influence of Drugs/Alcohol
- Careless Driving
- Exhibition Driving
- Reckless Driving/Speeding Contest
- Driving While Impaired
- Fleeing Law Enforcement/Peace Officer
- Making a False Accident Report
- Failure to stop/Report an Accident
- Homicide/Manslaughter/Assault arising out of the use of a Vehicle
- Driving while license is Suspended/Revoked/Canceled
- Leaving the Scene of a Crash
- Major Speeding (20 MPH or more over)

If there are any warrants, or unpaid traffic fines in any state, you may not be issued a CDL permit. Applicants must be 18 years old to drive intra-state and 21 years old to drive inter-state. These requirements refer to all types of driving, construction, Over the Road and DOT jobs.

Background Study Notice: Other background issues could affect your ability to get a license or get a job in this field. If you have been arrested, charged or convicted of any criminal offense, it is your responsibility to investigate the impact that the arrest, charge or conviction may have on your chances for employment in the field you intend to study.
